Key Text: The Great Kapock Tree

Writing focus: The children will be learning about and then applying Show not tell techniques through description of how a character moves and speaks

Grammar: In class we will be looking at expanded noun phrases and homophones

Word Reading / Comprehension: As part of our reading this term, we will be looking at retrieval, retrieving and record key information/ and key details from both fiction and non-

Term: 3

Computing

Focus: spreadsheets
In this unit, children will be introduced to spreadsheets and explore the different tools needed to create and edit spreadsheets

Maths

Year 3: In this unit, we will be looking at multiplying and dividing 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers, with and without exchanges using flexible partitioning. We will also be looking at dividing with remainders. We will then begin to look at length and perimeter.

Year 4: In this unit, children will be looking at multiplying/dividing by 10 and 100 and multiplying and dividing 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers using the formal written method. The children will then move onto length and perimeter

Quest: Forces

In this quest, we will be learning out forces in this stand alone unit.

Music

Focus: Three little birds
In this unit of Work the focus will be around one song: Three Little Birds by Bob Marley. The material presents an integrated approach to music where games, elements of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.), singing and playing instruments are all linked. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song, children will listen and appraise other Reggae songs.

Geography

Focus: All around the world
In this Unit, the children will take a closer look at where the countries of the world are located, and some of the ways geographers describe locations. Children will learn to locate and describe places using longitude and latitude, and find out about some of the important lines that delineate specific areas of the Earth - the Equator, the Hemispheres, the Poles and the Tropics. Finally, by looking more closely at the lines of longitude, children will develop their understanding of time zones.

Science

Physics: Forces
In this unit children will be investigation forces and magnets. We will be looking at the two different poles found on a magnet and which objects/materials attract and repel.

RE

Focus: What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?
In this unit the children will be learning about the beliefs Hindus have about Gods, understand the impact this has on their lives and make connections.

Art

Focus: Insects
In this unit, children will be exploring the different techniques of drawing, painting and sculpture and using these to create artwork based on insects.

PE

Focus: Cognitive Skills/REAL Gym In this unit, children will have the opportunity to, through a range of activities and sports, develop their cognitive skills in PE. Over the unit, they will be focusing upon: their dynamic balance, coordination skills, personal challenge, using self-assessment, coping well when things become challenging and improving performance.

French

Focus: Shapes
In this unit, children will be recapping on their previous knowledge and learning the French translations for different shapes and applying to sentences.

PHSE

Focus: Being me in my world
In this unit, children will be learning about getting to know each and looking at what makes a school a dream school, learning about rewards and consequences.
