Significant person

This year we will continue to introduce to our curriculum a significant person. This is a person who has had a strong impact on our way of life or culture and that we think would be important for the children to know about. For our first person this year, we have chosen Marie Curie who is most famous for the discovery of the elements polonium and radium. Please find out about her with the children at home.

In this quest, children will first of all be visited by a local person who organises and takes part in many mountain climbs who will then set the children a challenge of creating a video in groups explaining the experience of climbing a mountain.
