Quest: Into the Unknown

Who was Christopher Columbus and why was he so important?

In this History based quest, the children will be working towards creating a non-chronological report all about Christopher Columbus and his llife and acheievements. We will be developing the skills of historical enquiry such as using a source to answer a question and retelling events in the correct sequence

Homework ideas

- Find out about other famous explorers. What did they discover and how?
- Find out what life on a ship might have been like in the time of Christopher Columbus. What jobs would needed to have been done? What food would have been eaten?
- Look at a world map. See if you can identify and name some of the countries and continents. Which country would you like to explore?

Book Recommendation

Our book recommendation of the term is 'Shhh!' by Sally Grindley. Ash class have absolutely loved reading this book and have voted for it for our daily reading pledge several times.

Although first published in 1991, this book has not lost any of its magic and appeal to young children.

While touring an intriguing castle, the reader is warned not to wake the sleeping giant. Ash class love the suspenseful build up as we are drawn in to the story, being very careful not to wake the giant as we lift the flaps and look at the detailed and magical illustrations. This is a book that you will enjoy reading with your child time and time again!
