
This term our focus book will be used in our literacy and guided reading lessons in order to get a full understanding of the novel I Hawthorn class we will be reading Skellig by David Almond



Expectations

Homework

Homework expectations are that children <u>must</u> spend a least 15 minutes a week on TTRS practicing their timestable recall.

Children will also be set weekly spelling homework on the spelling shed website. This is set every Friday and to be completed by the following Thursday.

It is also important to make sure children are reading regularly at home. Please note, we will be checking to ensure that children are completing the homework as this is a valued addition to their education. Staff will be contacting parents if the homework expectations are not being met.

Quest: What is the perfect farm our local area?

In this quest the children will be finding out about farming. As a part of this they will be exploring the early history of farming as they look at the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age and how people at these different times got food and first developed personal and then traded farms. They will also explore plant growth in their science and art work before designing their own farm for the local area.
