Love 2 Read

At Cottingham we love to read and to share a love of reading with the children. Every day we have time to share a story in Ash class, we even put the fireplace on the screen to get cosy and enjoy this time together. In Ash class we choose two books which are displayed each day and children use their counter to vote for their favourite choice. It's considered a very important job to be the person who counts the votes and reveals the winning book!

Ash class also have a book review basket which the children can choose to take home and write about their favourite book. They can then bring it back into school and share with their peers. We had lots of amazing reviews and books shared with us last year so I look forward to seeing some new reviews this year.

Expectations

As a class and a school, we will be discussing the expectations of the coming year. Children will be encouraged to always try their best and to respect adults and children, as well as the environment around them. Children are expected to 'care, build, follow and think' in their learning and their behaviour. 'Compassion and kindness' are the values we will be focussing on this term.

Homework

Please encourage your child to log on to **TTRS** at home. Children should be completing 15 minutes per week to support their knowledge of number. Children enjoy the competition of the Ash class TTRS leader board! It would be great to see many of the children on the leaderboard. For younger children, if this proves tricky then please complete together or allow them to write down times tables/number patterns to use.

Spelling Shed should also be used at home to practice spellings set by KS1 teachers which will reflect their learning in Phonics. Please also use the Phonics videos sent home.

Daily reading is also part of your child's homework. If you can, please pop a note in your child's reading record to show what you have read at home.

Log in details will be shared with you to access Spelling Shed if you do not already have them. Please support children in accessing the tasks set for them as well as spelling games and activities to develop their reading and knowledge of words.

QUEST

Quest: The lady with the lamp

As part of this history learning quest, the children will be discovering all about Florence Nightingale. They will discover the role she played in history and her impact on healthcare and nursing today. At the beginning of this journey, the children will find out about life in Victorian times, inventions and rich and poor society.

Homework ideas

Please see below a range of ideas for you to support the children with their learning quest work at home:

- Create a collage by finding materials from around home, e.g. tin foil, newspaper, magazine, fabric to create a layered effect and explore different textures to make their own picture or pattern.
- Save some empty spray bottles and fill with water and a little bit of paint. Then spray onto paper to create your own pictures of patterns—Banksy style.
- Research Florence Nightingale who was she and what did she do? Use BBC bitesize website to collect information and create a fact file about 'The lady with the lamp'.
