The children are still enjoying TTRS and some are scoring very highly. As we do not really set homework during the holidays, please do encourage the use of the App. Please do ensure that it IS actually the child who is logging in and accessing the App and is they who are completing the challenges!!! I/we would love to see more parents/carers and family members in attendance.
