# **Parking**




Please see the letter/email below that I received recently. I replied to the local resident inviting him to discuss the matter further to me but as yet have had no reply. It is frustrating to receive such an email as I do feel the situation is very much avoidable. I did also reply to explain that a number of residents do park on the grass verges themselves. As I have done before, please do help us to avoid such emails by parking in a considerate and safe manner. It is still surprising that parents/carers/residents still park on corners or even across the zebra crossing which is unacceptable and avoidable.

... I am emailing to express our disappointment of the lack of respect shown by the parents/guardians of the school children attending Cottingham Primary school. Each morning and afternoon the drivers of some vehicles are parking on the grass verge on the corner of Main Street, Cottingham and the grass is being churned up and destroyed. There are deep tyre tracks where vehicles continually park on the soft grass verge and it is unsightly and will take time for it to recover. This is showing a lack of respect to the residents and community of Cottingham. I am sure these drivers don't park their vehicles on their own lawns. Would it be possible for the school to raise this issue with the parents either by letter, email or something on your news letter letting them know that there are many residents unhappy with the situation. # **Phonics**























# **Governors Update**

### **Additional Bank Holiday**


An additional bank holiday in honour of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III will take place on Monday 8th May 2023. As this date had previously been announced as the first day of the 2023 key stage 2 (KS2) test week in England, a change to the KS2 test schedule next year will be necessary.

Ministers have considered the situation carefully and have decided that KS2 tests will take place in the same week with tests following the usual order but each taking place one day later than originally planned. As such, the new schedule will be:

- Tuesday 9th May: English grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) papers 1 (questions) and 2 (spelling)
- Wednesday 10th May: English reading paper
- Thursday 11th May: mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)

Friday 12th May: mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)
