Headteacher's Welcome

Dear Parent/Carer,

I have had a fantastic week, with 18 super children and two equally amazing colleagues. We all visited the Frontier Centre in Irthlingborough for the week long, year 6 residential. The week was made even more special with the weather that was ideal for the week. Each morning, we woke to sunshine across the wonderful countryside. Even though we are only a short bus ride from school, we could easily be in the Welsh countryside. The children took part in activities that tested their bravery, team work, perseverance and emotional intelligence. In their own ways, all children took part in a way that suited them. I have added a few pictures to this newsletter that show you what will be in store for your children in the future. I am proud that we can offer these experiences to children in years 2, 4 and 6.

I am always keen to thank everyone who makes these experiences possible. You fund the trips and trust us to take your children away. The staff give up their own time and throughout the week are on call 24 hours a day. A special mention also to the children who want to take part and look forward to such events. May they continue to be planned for years to come. A special mention to Mrs Southcombe and Mrs Pfadenhauer who help to organise all visits. They are already booking up for 24/25. For some visits, I am able to book and use mini buses that are loaned by schools within our trust. By doing this, we can reduce costs dramatically. *Owning our own mini bus is something that I really want to look into and would always welcome ideas or sponsorship!!*

Back at school this week, Mrs Delo took charge and ensured all other years carried on with their learning. From the adventure centre, I was able to check on learning and in particular access to TTRS. It is disappointing that not ALL children have accessed TTRS to complete their weekly homework task. We only ask for a minimum of 15 minutes per week and would expect you support in ensuring that multiplications become a part of the weekly schedule along with reading and access to spellings. Teachers will continue to monitor homework completion and where required will put intervention in place at school. Thanks as always for your support. I love TTRS as it allows for some competition between children, classes and even schools.

From reading the PE update, you will see that we have had some sporting success with teams performing well in a number of events and in some cases winning medals and silverware. We will need to add extra cleaning hours soon to dust down all of the trophies that they are winning. I was able to support the cross country runners last week as they ran so well at West Glebe Park. Some children even made it through to the county event and we will have more news about that soon. I look forward to taking the year 3/4 teams to a football tournament on Monday also. Look out in the next news letter for more results and updates.

Whilst I was away, I missed the first KS1 Love 2 Lunch of the year. I always enjoy these events so was disappointed to have missed this and for some of you, your first lunch with us. We look forward to seeing you at events during the next months and especially during the Christmas period. I am also looking forward to out usual guitar, drums and musical concerts. It will be delivered before the 1st December so that it can be decorated and ready for the Christmas Fayre taking place on Saturday 2nd December. Please enjoy reading through the news and as always, do share with children and family & friends.




ROCK UK



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Parking



Dear Parents and Carers,

Your Neighbourhood Policing teams regularly undertake public consultation to determine the most significant concerns within the local community. A recurring theme is road safety and virtually all schools experience traffic congestion issues during drop off and pick up times. We regularly receive complaints about inconsiderate and dangerous parking around schools.

Examples include parking on pavements, causing obstructions, blocking driveways, parking on double yellow lines and allowing children to exit vehicles whilst stopped on School Keep Clear 'zig-zags' or in queuing traffic. There have even been instances of abusive and threatening behaviour by parents and carers.

This behaviour and standard of driving and parking are wholly unacceptable and most importantly put your children's safety at risk. As such we appeal to you to consider the following during these periods:

- Park with consideration to residents **do not** block or overlap driveways.
- **Do not** park on the corners of junctions as you reduce views making it awkward for vehicles to safely turn into or out of a street.
- Do not stop on or park across pedestrian crossings or school zig-zag markings
- **Do not** drive along pavements when the road is blocked be patient and wait for traffic to clear.
- On congested routes **plan-ahead** and do not proceed unless there is a clear space to use to give way to oncoming traffic or to allow traffic to give way to you.
- If possible; join with other parents and share journeys to reduce the number of vehicles used and/or avoid congested routes.

- Be aware that **children do not easily judge the speed of traffic** and may step out into the road. 30mph is a limit, not a target and much slower speeds are often required to negotiate busy roads safely.
- Pedestrians, especially with young children, should use the side of the road with the widest pathway and wherever possible protected from flowing traffic by barriers or parked cars.
- Turn off your engine when parked engines left idling contribute to air pollution.
- Behave in a manner than is respectful towards others including pedestrians and local residents.

The above list is not exhaustive and there will be occasions where drivers or pedestrians will make errors of judgement, especially under pressure. We are all human so please be patient. Corby has many schools and officers will complete ad-hoc checks and challenge people where appropriate. Persistent obstructive parking may result in drivers receiving a fine and this is easily avoidable with a little more thought as to where to park or wait.

Despite the number of complaints, we know that most people do want to do the right thing and drive safely and responsibly. We therefore request that you remember the points above when parking, dropping off or collecting children from school.

EScooter Safety Awareness



Thinking about purchasing an e-scooter for Christmas?

I am the Safer Roads Manager for Northants Police and am writing to you as a representative of the Northamptonshire Safer Roads Alliance (NSRA). As we approach this festive season, we wanted to take the opportunity to address an emerging trend that has raised concerns in the community, that is the use of electric scooters, commonly referred to as "e-scooters." The safety and well-being of all road users are of paramount importance and in particular our children. We know e-scooters have become increasingly popular and whilst we understand the appeal of these devices, we believe it is crucial that we inform you of the legalities and potential dangers associated with them. LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS E-scooters, like any other motorised vehicle, are subject to laws and regulations. The use of private e-scooters on public roads and footpaths is currently illegal in the UK. Parents and guardians should be aware of the legal implications and responsibilities that come with these devices to avoid potential legal issues. E-scooters available under the local trial operated by VOI are age restricted to persons 18 years and older who must hold a driving licence. SAFETY CONCERNS There are substantial safety concerns associated with e-scooters which can reach significant speeds and may not always be equipped with adequate safety features. As such, accidents and injuries related to e-scooter usage have become increasingly prevalent. These injuries can range from minor scrapes and bruises to more severe incidents, including head injuries and fractures
