

Well done to our new members of the 144 club- today we had 3 children and 2 different members of staff: Mrs Rutter and Mrs Smith. Great to see so many names appearing in the club.

I hope that you have all had the chance to practise your child's KIRFs with them over the course of the term but if not, please note that these can be downloaded for each year groups from both the website and also the class teams accounts.

It has been great to see that Hawthorn have won the class tournament this week with an average point score of 361. Beech were second with 302 and Oak had 145.

Class participation- here is a run down of what percentage of each class have been on TTRS this week:


Hawthorn- 78%

Beech- 78%


Oak- 100%

This means that there are a lot of children across the school who are not completing their homework- please try hard to ensure that this is completed as a minimum each week. Don't forget that 15 minutes of TTRS garage mode is expected homework each week- the percentage of children getting their homework completed is a lot lower than the percentage of children going on to TTRS. Only 36 children across the whole school completed the non-negotiable homework 15 minute homework last week.















































































#### **British Values**



As many of you are aware - last term we were awarded The Healthy School's Bronze Award!

The North Northamptonshire Healthy Schools Bronze Award is a set of evidence-based standards and self-auditing tool, designed to guide educational settings in improving the health and wellbeing of their school community.

We are going to base our project on the Five Ways to Wellbeing. Next week the children will be taking part in a baseline survey and from this we will generate targets and create an action plan.


